Good morning all, by the time you read my report the 2019 State Congress will be done and dusted. Vice President Les Warner will be chairing the meeting and will be able to inform you who the State Vice President is for the next three years.

The Sub Branch is in the process of ringing all our over 80yr old Service members to see if there is any way that we can assist them to make their everyday lives a little easier. It will take a while as we have over 300 to ring. Several members have already been visited in their homes.

Our Sub Branch at this time has 1169 Service members in total, the largest number in our history.

Six of our volunteers will be taking part in First Aid training next week, they do this in their own time and update each year.

VETERANS HEALTH WEEK this year will be 26th October to 3rd November. We are looking at running a barefoot bowls day at the Cleveland Bowls Club on Sunday, 20th October 2019. The Sub Branch, Women's Auxiliary and Younger Veterans Redlands will all be involved.

Management Committee member Greg Saunders has retired so we thought we should give him a job. He has agreed to organise bus trips for us. We are able to apply for a Veteran and Community Grant from Department of Veteran Affairs to help subsidise the cost of trips. He is at present looking into an overnight trip to Toowoomba for the Carnival of Flowers. More next month.

A number of our Wellbeing Support Officers will be attending a two day course facilitated by State RSL on 23th and 24th July at Redlands RSL. This will inform them of their duties supporting Welfare/Compensation Advocates.

THE COMPENSATION/WELLBEING ADVOCATES have had a busy month again with sixty clients visiting Headquarters since our May bugle was published. The majority of these visits are clients visiting our Advocates in relation to Compensation claims. Our Home visits have increased due to the ringing of the over 80's and some feedback has come back to our Wellbeing advocates.

THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY assisted the Younger Veterans Redlands with packing goods for Care Packages for any veterans and their families who may need a bit of a hand. The goods were donated by Coles and around 80 packages were bagged up for distribution.

The ladies are holding their July meeting at historic Ormiston House. The ladies will be transported to the venue in vintage cars supplied by Bayside Vehicle Restorers.

GOLDEN OLDIES is rolling along nicely every fortnight with an average attendance of thirty. They enjoyed the Cleveland Air Magic Skippers visit last meeting.

DEFENCE FORCE RETIREMENT AND DEATH BENEFITS (DFRDB) INVESTIGATION

COMMONWEALTH OMBUDSMAN

OVERVIEW

We are undertaking an own motion investigation into the administration of the Defence Force Retirement and Death Benefits (DFRDB) scheme, specifically the issue of commutation.

The investigation is focussed on the accuracy of information about commutation provided to scheme members by the Department of Defence and/or the Australian Defence Force and scheme administrators (including the Commonwealth Superannuation Corporation (CSC)).

WHAT WE ARE INVESTIGATING

We are only investigating what information scheme members were given about commuting a portion of their pension.

Note—we will not be considering issues relating to indexation of the DFRDB, or any other aspects of the scheme as it was established by Parliament.

WE INVITE YOU TO SHARE YOUR CIRCUMSTANCES

We are inviting scheme members to share information relevant to commutation. We are also seeking information from Defence and CSC.

In the second World War, Bomber Command and later the US Eighth Air Force, provided the only allied offensive in Western Europe after Dunkirk until the D-Day landings. Of the 10,000 Australians who served with Bomber Command, 3486 were killed. Fewer than two per cent of all Australians who enlisted in the Second World War fought in Bomber Command, they accounted for almost 20 per cent of all deaths in combat.

A lighter side, the Branch informal social gatherings every Wednesday at 3pm in the Anzac Lounge of Redlands RSL Club, continue to be very popular with good attendances. These gatherings are important to prevent social isolation.

Did you know?

The Anzac Centenary has inspired many to better understand the First World War and Queensland's military history, leading to the rediscovery of exciting, interesting and unusual details.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Australian Government first supported the idea of a national network of research laboratories during the First World War. Inspired by a similar move in Great Britain and in response to the need for technological progress to advance the war effort, Prime Minister William 'Billy' Hughes announced the Advisory Council of Science and Industry, which is now known as CSIRO.

ANZAC ENDORSEMENTS

Instead of looking to film and sports stars during the First World War, many brands sought defence force personnel to promote their products. Troops gave testimonials and endorsements to help sell a wide range of products, from chewing gum to cold remedies. Perhaps the most publicised spokesperson was Lieutenant Colonel Leslie Cecil Maygar, a Victoria Cross recipient who appeared in many Rexona promotions, advising that he used their healing ointment "... on active service in Gallipoli and Egypt, and have found it excellent for the skin, especially in the trenches".

FUNDRAISING FLOWERS

Selling imitation flowers to raise money for past and present servicemen and women is not new. The Australian War Memorial has a collection of more than 50 fundraising badges Lance Corporal Frederik John Knapman collected while on leave in England in 1918 - including imitation pansies, daisies and lilies.

MEALS ON WHEELS

While many frontline troops had to survive on hard tack biscuits and bully beef, some men in the Australian Imperial Force were fortunate to be served hot meals prepared on the Wiles Travelling Army Field Kitchen. Designed by an Australian Boer War veteran, this horse drawn kitchen included a steam boiler, oven, hot and cold tanks and two steamers. The kitchen was built to handle rough terrain and withstand enemy fire, allowing regimental cooks to get closer to the frontline.

BLOOD ON ICE

With countless men suffering terrible wounds each day, it's unsurprising that the First World War drove many medical practitioners to explore new and improved treatments. During his service, Lawrence Bruce Robertson of the Canadian Expeditionary Force developed an improved method for blood transfusion (in which blood was transferred via syringes, instead of directly from the donor to the patient). Oswald Hope Robertson, and American volunteer stationed with the British 3rd Army Casualty Clearing Station in France, discovered how to store blood on ice until required - establishing the world's first blood bank.

RETURNING FIRE

With resources running low, allied troops were encouraged to collect spent ammunition from the battlefield. Salvage areas were set up where experts prepared the bullets and shells so they could be 'returned' to the enemy.

THIS MONTH IN AUSTRALIAN MILITARY



DATE	TITLE	EVENT
1 June 1918	RAN aircraft first used in combat	First use of aircraft in combat by ships of the Royal Australian Navy in the Heligoland Bight. Aircraft were launched from HMAS Sydney and Melbourne to intercept two German aircraft.
3-6 June 1942	Battle of Midway	The battle of Midway was the first decisive defeat inflicted on Japan by the United States in the Second World War. The battle shifted the balance of sea power in the Pacific towards the Allies and forced Japan to abandon plans for advances on New Caledonia, Fiji and Samoa and delayed their offensive in New Guinea.
6 June 1944	D-Day	Allies land in Normandy, opening up a third front against Germany and beginning an eastward drive across northern Europe that ended with Germany's surrender in May 1945.
8 June 1941	Australians attack Vichy French in Syria	7th Division and Imperial forces attack Vichy French in Syria.
10 June 1940	Italy declares war on the Allies	Hoping to profit from the German successes early in the war, the Italian dictator Mussolini declared war on the Allies in June 1940, by which time the most vocal Italian dissidents were in exile or in prison.
15 June 1951	HMAS Bataan bombards Chongjin, Korea	After the war in Korea had ended, the Chinese leader, Chairman Mao Zedong, admitted that one of the principal factors in denying the Chinese and North Korean victory was the superiority of UN naval power. Australia's contribution to the naval war in Korea was significant.
16 June 1942	HMAS Nestor sunk	HMAS Nestor was in the Mediterranean, north of Tobruk, when she was bombed and sunk.
16 June 1948	Malayan Emergency declared	The Australian involvement in Malayan Emergency lasted from 1950 to 1960, making it the longest continuing military commitment in our history. 39 Australian servicemen died in this conflict.
21 June 1951	3rd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment, awarded United States Presidential Distinguished Unit Citation	United States Presidential Distinguished Unit Citation awarded to 3rd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment, for "extraordinary heroism and outstanding performance" at the battle of Kapyong, Korea.
