- President Alan Harcourt spoke about the President's Luncheon on Sunday 23rd October and the October Quarterly meeting which will be held downstairs in the new function room.
- In 2014 the City of Redlands offered Freedom of Entry to the Air Force which was accepted by 95Wing. A letter has gone to Council Committee members and if they get the vote to go ahead they are hoping to line this up with Remembrance Day 2023 as it will take 12 months to plan.
- Graham Hargreaves asked that the homeless accommodation situation be put forward to SED as Sub Branches and Advocates don't know what is going on. This will be followed up with SED.
- President Alan Harcourt advised that Paul Oates has prepared a documentary on Ukraine and this will be shown early next year.

Treasurer's Report

We have now reached the halfway mark with the renovations at Redlands RSL and with a renovation of this size some areas are starting to show the effects which are normal. After a solid start to 2022 this trend has kept going up until the last two trading months.

A quick snapshot as at the end of August, Net Profit is sitting on \$1,339,665 against a budget of \$687,154 which is a variance of \$652,511 or 95%. Areas that are feeling it no doubt would be Sails Restaurant and bars due to a reduction of 30% seating, reduced operating and kitchen efficiency along with a modified menu.

The Redlands RSL is still in a very strong financial position with Gaming still trading above expectations.

Having recently returned from holidays, I took the opportunity to be briefed by our General Manager of the current situation. I was amazed seeing first-hand what the extensions and modifications were looking like. Whilst there has been pain, the gain to members and patrons will be enormous. In the interim, the two main areas that Management are focusing on are service and the bank balance.

League and Wellbeing totalled \$59,118, Overall Members Funds \$30,498,745, Current Asset Total \$10,333,478, Current Liabilities \$2,570,485 against Non-Current Liabilities \$2,505,570 and Non-Current Liabilities (Bank Business Loan) \$2,440,000.

I have confirmed with the Financial Controller that all statutory payments including employee entitlements are up to date and no statutory payments are under any repayment arrangement.

Please ensure if you are going to dine in Sails Restaurant to book ahead to avoid disappointment.

History

1 Sept 1939	Germany invades Poland	The German invasion of Poland led to the declaration of war against Germany by the United Kingdom and France and began the Second World War.		
3 Sept 1939	Britain, France, Australia, and New Zealand declare war on Germany	The German invasion of Poland led to the declaration of war against Germany by the United Kingdom and France and began the Second World War.		
7 Sept 1943	Liberator crash kills 59 Australians	A liberator crashed on take-off at Port Moresby hitting five trucks carrying men of the 2/33rd Battalion; 15 were killed instantly, 44 died of their injuries, and 92 were injured but survived.		
8 Sept 1951	Peace treaty (Second World War) signed with Japan	The peace treaty signalled the formal end of hostilities with Japan, though the fighting had ended some six years before.		
14 Sept 1914	HMA Submarine AE1 lost off New Guinea	The AE1 and AE2 were the first submarines to serve with the Royal Australian Navy. The AE1 disappeared without trace during operations for the capture of German New Guinea.		
15 Sept 1939	Australian Government announces mobilisation of the militia and the establishment of the second AIF for service abroad	Australia needed to raise a volunteer force for overseas service in the Second World War while the militia were only allowed to serve in Australian territories.		
19 Sept 1918	5th Light Horse Brigade capture Nablus	Nablus fell to the Australians during the final period of the war against Turkey. British Empire troops also made impressive advances and destroyed several Turkish armies between the Mediterranean coast and the Jordan River.		
20 Sept 1912	Official approval given for the establishment of a military Central Flying School. Official formation of the Australian Flying Corps	The Australian Flying Corps went on to serve in Mesopotamia, the Middle East, and the Western Front and was the forerunner of the RAAF.		
21 Sept 1914	German New Guinea surrenders	The former German New Guinea was placed under a military government until 1921, when Australia received a mandate from the League of Nations to govern the country.
