

President's Report

I hope this finds everyone in good health.

Since the AGM, life has been like a whirlwind coming to grips with everything that the position of President entails. My sincere thanks to Alan for his assistance during this transition period which could not come at a busier time in the RSL calendar.

Before proceeding further with this report, I need to pay tribute to Alan and Linda Harcourt for the extraordinary contribution they have made to our sub-branch and club over a long period of time. They will leave a massive void that needs to be filled. However, their legacy will continue, in true character Alan and Linda have offered to continue helping with the Advocacy and Welfare of the sub-branch. I am extremely grateful for this kind gesture. It is never an easy task to take over from someone who has been in a position for a long time with their experience and history.

Freedom of the City is an ancient honour granted to military units, allowing them the privilege to march into the city 'with drums beating, colours flying, and bayonets fixed'. This military tradition is today an entirely ceremonial honour, usually bestowed upon a unit with historic ties to the area, as a token of appreciation for their long and dedicated service. RAAF 95 Wing was originally awarded Freedom of Redland City in 2014 and on 13th April 2024 they exercised their right, when they marched through the City, challenged by local authorities, and allowed to pass after presentation of the scroll of authorisation. They then marched all the way to Redlands RSL to conclude the celebration. A flypast by a low flying C17A Globemaster as the parade passed the saluting dais enhanced the spectacle.

One of the most important days on the RSL calendar, Anzac Day, our national day of remembrance in Australia and New Zealand that broadly commemorates all Australians and New Zealanders who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations; and the contribution and suffering of all those who have served. The day is fast approaching, and I know that Michael and his team have been very busy with planning and preparations. Redlands RSL is reputed to be the third largest Anzac Day commemoration in OLD behind Brisbane

and the Currumbin. I encourage everyone to participate in commemoration some way on this day, whether it be at a memorial service, a march, or at home; and to remember the three pillars of Care, Commemoration and Camaraderie. Take care.

Treasurer's Report

Once again, my report is a good news story. The Redlands RSL is really cementing itself as a destination to visit with its extensive array of offers.

After three trading months, we are in a strong financial position.

As at the end of March 2024 the Year to Date Net Profit Actual is \$281,466; Budget \$40,849 with a Variance of \$240,617.

Sails Restaurant is becoming consistently booked out on a regular basis, this is on top of a further increase of seating. Cove Café is another star performer, currently showing a 58% increase on last year. The seating in the Bar area another master stroke. Membership is strong, promotional activities and club draws are really helping in the mix. Another great initiative was to not charge public holiday surcharges, which was another factor and went over well with members.

Year to Date Overall Members Funds are \$31,328,218; Current Asset total is \$3,587,778. Current Liabilities total is \$3,020,841. Our Non-Current Liabilities Bank Business Loan is \$6,166,693. Our Cash Reserves remain resilient at \$1,780,953 and there is a further \$904,297 in Operational Funds.

League and Wellbeing expenditure totalled \$121,249 for March. Here are just some of the areas as to where the money is being allocated: Member Amenities \$49,012; Home Maintenance \$1,168; Anzac Day expenses \$9,448 and League Bus \$1,010.

I have confirmed with the Financial Controller that all statutory payments including Employee Entitlements are up to date and no statutory payments are under any repayment scheme.

In summary, yet another good trading month across the board which proves the initiatives implemented are working.

SOUTH EAST DISTRICT MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

11th APRIL 2024 SED MEETING:

The South East District Meeting, Chaired by District President Kerry Gallagher AM, was the first of the year for Sub-Branch Presidents to attend. This meeting takes a different format to the usual SED meetings. It was also the first meeting held simultaneously with the main meeting, for the sub-branch modern veterans who could attend, to brainstorm strategies to attract more younger veterans to join the RSL.

The Sub-Branch President's meeting began with a very important presentation from Forest Lake Sub-Branch on the Assistance Dog program that is available to all veterans. The program administered by Forest Lake Sub-Branch and partially funded by a Defence Bank foundation, provides suitable dogs with accredited training to always accompany a veteran and recognise the symptoms of anxiety and PTSD; and provide appropriate support.

An open forum followed, and each President was given an opportunity to provide a short dialogue on their Sub-Branch. The problems of encouraging younger veterans to join the league was common to most sub-branches.

A disturbing trend being experienced by some sub-branches since the recent council elections, has been the sudden extraordinary requirements that they must attain to hold Anzac services in parks. These sub-branches, who thought they had all the boxes ticked for Anzac Day, are now faced with massive costs to meet these requirements which are out of reach for most. They are hoping that common sense will prevail.

I raised the issue of amalgamated sub-branches like ours still not being recognised in the RSL QLD Constitution and the long promised amendments; and our intention to pursue this further.

SING SING SING REDLANDS

On Monday 25th March I was invited to attend a performance of a choir for people living with dementia and their carers at the Redland Performing Arts Centre in Cleveland. I found the performance delivered an uplifting memorable experience, and something the community of Redland City should be proud of. The Sing Sing Sing Redland Choir helps the participants to foster a sense of community experiencing music-making under the creative direction of Mellisa Gill and her team. RAPC invites the community and music enthusiasts along on Monday morning, during the school term, especially people living with dementia and their carers. It would be nice to support this wonderful community. Report by John Butler.





SINGING FOR JOY IN THE REDLANDS!

Each week, people gather in the Redlands and Brisbane to sing together — not just for the sheer joy of singing, but also to make social connections with others who are living with dementia and their carers. Research has demonstrated that group singing can

improve physical and emotional health and wellbeing, increase social connectedness, and reduce feelings of loneliness.

Sing Sing, Queensland's first dementia choir, started in Brisbane in 2021 and in February this year launched its first Redlands choir for those living with dementia and their families, carers and friends. Sing Sing Sing was founded and is conducted by Melissa Gill, a professional choral conductor and voice coach.

Melissa started Sing Sing Sing after her father's dementia diagnosis. "I saw the loneliness and isolation. He needed a social experience; he needed an opportunity to feel joy. My mother needed an opportunity to make connection with other people who understood", Melissa said. "Music is a universal language. Everyone has the power to open their mouths and express themselves through song. I know that music can make a difference."

Sing Sing Sing first performed in the Redlands in 2023 after partnering with the Redlands Coast Dementia Community and Redlands City Council to organise a concert during Dementia Action Week concert - 'Rhythms of Joy: A Concert Celebrating the Lives of People Living with Dementia'

In February this year, the choir began weekly rehearsals at RPAC and held a successful 'Come and Sing With Us' event on 25th March to mark the end of the first term. The choir performed and then joined family, friends and the community for a spirited rehearsal, singing warm-up tunes and favourite songs. 45 people attended this event, and included morning tea.

"You can't sing and not feel happy! It just makes you feel part of humanity. I couldn't get over the joy that it gave me - you feel human, connected and loved," said choir member Margaret.

Sing Sing Sing will continue rehearsals at RPAC every Monday in Term 2 (school term) at 10am with a further 'Come and Sing With Us' event scheduled for Monday 17th June (last rehearsal for Term 2).

Stistory) APRIL

DATE	TITLE	EVENT
4 April 1918	First action at Villers-Bretonneux	Villers-Bretonneux, overlooking the Somme and within artillery range of Amiens, was a principal objective when the German Spring Offensive was in its dying stages in early April. They were repulsed by the 9th Brigade from the 3rd Australian Division and some British units.
6 April 1952	1st Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment, arrives in Korea	The battalion remained in Korea until September 1953.
7 April 1916	Australians reach the Western Front	First Australian units of the 2nd Division arrived on Western Front and were introduced to fighting on the Western Front in what was called the 'nursery sector' in the relatively quiet area around Armentieres, France.
8 April 1918	Repatriation Department established	Once soldiers were demobilised all tasks aimed at their rehabilitation and return to civilian life became the responsibility of the Repatriation Department.
11 April 1917	First battle of Bullecourt, Western Front	The 4th Australian Division and 62nd British Division attempted to penetrate the Hindenburg Line at Bullecourt where they were unsuccessfully supported by tanks. Over 1,000 Australians became prisoners of war, the largest number in a single action in the First World War. 3,000 became casualties.
13 April 1983	Dedication of the Rats of Tobruk memorial	The memorial, on Anzac Parade, was dedicated by the Governor-General of Australia, the Right Hon Sir Ninian Stephen. The memorial commemorates the Australian and Allied servicemen who died during the siege of Tobruk in 1941.
25 April 1916	First commemoration of Anzac Day	The first anniversary of the Gallipoli landings was widely observed in Australia. Large crowds attended church services and public ceremonies . The day was also commemorated by Australian and New Zealand servicemen in Egypt and London.
29 April 1965	Prime Minister Menzies announces the commitment of an infantry battalion to Vietnam	Australia's involvement in Vietnam was a gradual process. By April 1965 there were 100 members of the Australian Army Training Team Vietnam in Vietnam. The commitment of a battalion represented a major step in Australia's involvement and precipitated further increases in the number of Australians serving in Vietnam until reductions began in 1970.
