Commemorating Remembrance Day – 11 November

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, Australians pause to remember those who gave their lives in service to our country. Remembrance Day marks the anniversary of the Armistice that ended World War I in 1918, but today it also honours all Australians who have served and sacrificed in wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations.

Join us as we observe one minute's silence at 11am, reflecting on the courage, dedication, and selflessness of those who fought for our freedom. Together, let us remember their sacrifice and ensure their legacy lives on.

Bar sales were \$2,463,337.62 which is +11.77% on the same period for 2024.

Sails Bistro sales were \$2,868,169.63 which is +2.20% on the same period for 2024.

Function sales were \$256,420.03 which is -1.31% on the same period for on 2024.

Coffee-shop sales were \$766,200.99 which is +13.00% on the same period for 2024.

Keno sales were \$1,705,541.30 which is +7.14% on the same period for 2024.

Net Profit/Loss unaudited \$1,031,034.40 which is +45.26% on the same period for 2024.

All areas except functions still showing slight growth which is good to see. With the Grand View opening it will be interesting to see if we hold our own for the last quarter. We can only wait and see what impact this will have and in what areas. Fingers crossed not to severe, but I'm sure everyone will go for a look.

Treasurer's Report

Redlands RSL continues to operate as a very professional organisation under the strong administration of General Manager Peter Harrison, his management crew and finally the various team who ensure the needs and requests of our members and visitors to the club are more than adequately catered for.

The steadily increasing monthly results achieved during 2025 are a clear testimony to the efficiency of a cohesive team that ensures such outcomes be accomplished on a continuing basis.

The utilisation of shrewd business skills enabled the renovations in the Cove Café to be undertaken without too much disruption to our patrons. The staff working in the Café displayed first-rate skills in their resilience to change during the operation from the temporary area.

It would be extremely remiss in my role as Treasurer, {on behalf of the Chairman and the RSL Board} if I failed to express our sincere appreciation to all the dedicated volunteers who work loyally, and so professionally, for Redlands RSL. The worth of those wonderful people can never be valued. Without volunteers so many functions provided by the RSL could not be delivered to our members, especially our veterans.

Estimated value (at \$33.49 per hour) \$260,619 for nine months or \$347,491 per annum

Membership has shown consistent growth in 2025, averaging around 828 new members per month. If this trend continues, we could finish the year with the strongest ever end of year figure. We have one of the highest levels of RSL League membership in the state with 1225 members.

I have confirmed with the Financial Controller that all statutory payments including Employee Entitlements are up to date and no statutory payments are under any repayment scheme.

Following a systematic review of all aspects of Redlands RSL financial

operating method with the Financial Controller over the last 2 months, I can confirm the organisation is in a strong trading position.

Farewell and a big vote of thanks to lan Gray for his excellent and tireless work with the three cadet units over many years. As a result of lan's retirement, I have been allocated the duties of Cadet Liaison Officer and will endeavour to have cadet reports from the three units in time for print in the Bugle.

There may be a few things RSL Club members do not know about in regard to cadets and to overcome that, the information below may fill in some gaps.

The Redlands based cadets is made up of Navy (TS Norfolk), Army (136 ACU) and Air Force (217 Sqn AAFC) as follows;

The **Navy cadets** belong to TS Norfolk (*Training Ship*), with current Commanding Officer Lieutenant Matthew Firth (ANC).

TS Norfolk, is part of Australian Navy Cadets, Australia's premier youth development, organisation. Open to school-aged youth, who can join in the year that they turn 13 up to the year they turn 18. Cadets participate in activities such as powerboating, sailing, drone flying, robotics, sealift experience, international exchanges, national activities & Anzac Day and other ceremonial parades. Cadets develop life skills, lifelong friendships, resilience, discipline and have fun. TS Norfolk parades every Thursday during the school term at Wellington Point State School between 5:30 pm & 8:30 pm. Come check us out, there is no obligation.

The **Army cadets** of 136 ACU (Army Cadet Unit) under Officer Commanding Captain Craig Buckingham (AAC) meets at Alexandra Hills State High School on Monday evening during school terms.

'136 ACU (Army Cadet Unit) is an Australian Army Cadets unit located in Alexandra Hills, Queensland, focused on developing leadership, resilience, and community skills in young people aged 12 to 18. The unit participates in activities like adventure training, leadership development, and STEM electives such as drones and robotics. A notable cadet from 136 ACU, Cadet Sergeant Aiden Foster, received a national Gold Commendation for developing a new training package for the bugle, which has been adopted by the national headquarters.'

The **Air Force cadets** from 217 Squadron Australian Air Force Cadet unit (AAFC) with Commanding Officer Squadron Leader Anthony McKeaten (AAFC) meet at Capalaba College on Monday evening during school terms.

The aim of the Australian Defence Force Cadets, which includes the AAFC, is "By predominantly voluntary effort, to better equip young people for community life by fostering initiatives, leadership, discipline and loyalty through training programs which are also designed to stimulate an interest in a particular arm of the Defence Force."

From this, the following specific aims have been developed:

- To give cadets a foundation of Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) knowledge and discipline
- To develop qualities of leadership, self-reliance and initiative
- To develop character and good citizenship in the widest sense
- To develop an interest in the RAAF and aviation generally
- To instil a knowledge of aviation history, and
- To encourage cadets to continue an active interest in aviation into their adult life '

WHAT IS A POPPY SERVICE?

A Poppy Service is a simple addition to a Funeral Service and usually encompasses the persons military service record, the reciting of The Ode, the sounding of The Last Post and Rouse, along with the provision of poppies for family, friends and mourners to place on the coffin. The Poppy Service is conducted by a Member of an RSL Sub Branch and is part of a Funeral Service.

A Poppy Service allows us to support the person in a final act of bravery; it means that we are with them at one of the most significant parts of their life and that they are not alone during this time. It allows us to commemorate the significant sacrifice they made during their life by serving the Australian Defence Force. We honour them gallantly, and we acknowledge their service, their sacrifice, and their life in a way that respects their military life.

WHO CAN HAVE A POPPY SERVICE

A Poppy Service is available to any person who has served in the Australian Defence Force, this includes Citizen Military Forces (CMF) and Allied Forces. They do not have to be a member of the RSL currently or previously. Poppy Services are provided as part of a Funeral Service free of charge. They are one of the ways that the RSL honour servicemen and women for their contribution and support their family through this difficult time.

Every funeral is an honour for us, and serving our Veterans is something that we take very seriously and we respect the traditions that are in place to honour and commemorate their lives.

Poppy Services ensure that those who have given so much for us are remembered and honoured respectfully with a personalised Service honouring their life and recognising their contribution and support to Australia in times of conflict and peace.

This can be carried out at your loved one's Burial, Cremation or Memorial Services.

The RSL Ritual Segment of your loved ones Service is for its members that highlight the services of the deceased to their country. This will include your loved one's service record being read, laying of poppies, reading of The Ode, The Last Post, one minutes silence and Reveille/Rouse.

You may wish to have the Australian flag laid on your loved one's coffin along with their Service Medals displayed on a frame as well as other military items, such as hats, photos and awards. A bugler can also be arranged to play The Last Post and Reveille/Rouse or we can use a recording.

An RSL representative will take the formal part of the Poppy service as a last tribute to a beloved comrade who served in defence of our nation.

A Moment of Silence – A unique moment to honour the deceased in silent contemplation, reflection, meditation or prayer.

Guard of Honour – If your loved one is being carried as part of the service, you may wish to have a guard of honour. It is important that you let your Funeral Director know if this is happening so they can ensure it all goes smoothly.

When meeting with your Funeral Director they will need to gather information from you regarding the application to the ADF archive records in Canberra for your loved ones Defence Eulogy.

The following information will be required:

- · Full name and date of birth
- Service Number Service Navy / Army / Air Force Era served, eg. WW2, Vietnam, Korea, National service etc.

THIS MONTH IN AUSTRALIAN MILITARY



DATE	TITLE	EVENT
3 Oct 1992	Dedication, Australian Vietnam Veterans' National Memorial	The Vietnam Veterans' National Memorial, Anzac Parade, Canberra, was opened by the Prime Minister, the Hon. Paul Keating, MP, and honours those Australians who served and died in the war in Vietnam.
5 Oct 1951	Second Australian battalion committed to Korea	From September 1950 the main Australian army unit in Korea had been the 3rd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment. The Australian Government annouced that the 1st Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment would join it in March 1952.
13 Oct 1969	HMAS Brisbane returns to Sydney	This was the end of the Brisbane's first deployment to Vietnam. A turret from HMAS Brisbane is on display outside the Memorial.
16 Oct 1967	Royal Australian Navy Helicopters deploy to Vietnam	An RAN Helicopter Flight Vietnam (RANHFV'67) joins the US Army's 135th Aviation Company at Vung Tau, supporting American troops in South Vietnam.
19 Oct 1945	War Widow's Guild of Australia founded	The guild's first president was Mrs Jessie Vasey, widow of Major General G.A. Vasey. It is still an active organisation today. Major General Vasey was killed in an aircraft accident near Cairns while returning to operational service.
21 Oct 1944	HMAS Australia damaged by Kamikaze aircraft	The Japanese first used special air units (Tok- kō-tai) to undertake suicide attacks on warships in the Allied fleet supporting the American landings on Leyte in the Phillipines.
23 Oct 1942	Battle of El Alamein begins	The battle of El Alamein, in Egypt, one of the turning point battles of the Second World War, began with a massive artillery bombardment preceding attacks by British and Australian divisions.
24 Oct 1942	Eora Creek, Kokoda Trail	The 16th Brigade, 7th Division, continued to drive the Japanese back along the Kokoda Trail but met heavy resistance at Eora Creek in late October.
27 Oct 1950	Chinese enter the Korean War	Having secretly moved at least 180,000 men into North Korea, Chinese forces began attacking south, surprising UN Command.
28 Oct 1916	First conscription referendum	Dismayed by heavy losses at Fromelles and Pozières on the Western Front, Prime Minister W.M. Hughes proposed that conscription be introduced for overseas service. The proposal was defeated.
