GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT: As presented in the Bugle on Page 15 – Peter Harrison

Peter Harrison delivered his final General Manager's report, advising that Chris Sartori will formally commence next Monday, with Peter available to support the transition during Chris's brief mid-month absence. Peter reflected on his 23½ years at the club, highlighting strong relationships with groups such as the Women's Auxiliary and Legacy Ladies, and expressing concern that the State RSL constitution requires modernisation to avoid clubs becoming generic community service organisations.

Peter confirmed he will assist informally until around Christmas, attending Veteran Cuppas, and possibly one more quarterly meeting, while emphasising he will not interfere in Chris's leadership. Peter endorsed Chris strongly and reported exceptional club performance: record results in the first six months following a record year, July tracking as one of the best on record, no gaming impact from the Grand View reopening, and strong dining numbers despite increased competition. He reaffirmed Redlands RSL as the preferred venue for gaming, Keno, meals, and socialising.

Peter advised that he and Chris Sartori will attend a council meeting on 7th August regarding Club Raby Bay and a potential final development stage over the car park, noting slow approvals. He concluded that the club is performing very strongly and anticipates another excellent year.

According to the media Australia is always in the grip of a depression one minute and a recession the next. However even the most respected of financial experts are still arguing about which is which anyway. The Reserve Bank will most certainly increase the interest by a further .25% when the meet in September.

The members of Redlands RSL are very loyal. Their continued patronage of "THEIR CLUB" continues to be revealed every month by the overall turnover in our main trading areas. Sails Restaurant is always active. It's almost impossible to get a table on several nights during the week, let alone the weekend. The "Little Gem" The Cove Café has as always operated consistently week by week for the whole year.

The major disbursements for League and Wellbeing during August and totals for the first 8 months were as follows: -

Good morning and welcome to Spring.

Once again, a busy month for Wellbeing and Headquarters with our clients keeping the Advocates and staff busy.

Two ladies attended a Wellbeing Support Officers Course at SEDRSL and have reported that it was very informative and contacts with other Sub Branches were established.

Our Wellbeing Support Officers meeting was well attended earlier in the month with three ladies from Bayside South joining us. These ladies are involved with the Sub Branch and the Redland Bay Women's Shed and have recently been appointed by their Sub Branch and they reached out to us for assistance and we have established contact and supplied information. Lovely to meet them and we wish them well.

Our August Wellbeing Support Officers meeting was held off site and we visited the Bayside Community Hub which is held on the first Wednesday of each month in the grounds of the Cleveland Uniting Church Passage Street Cleveland. We were warmly welcomed by Shanon and met with representatives from many different organisations including Centrelink and Medicare who advised that there is Medicare Mental Health unit in Cleveland. It is situated next to Cleveland Library in 40 Bloomfield Street and if you feel you need assistance or just someone to talk to you will be warmly welcomed. You are not required to present a DVA Card or a Medicare card.

On our last bus trip to the Port of Brisbane we had morning tea at the Brisbane Seafarers Centre which is situated within the Port precinct. Mission to Seafarers exists for the welfare of the worlds 1.6 million seafarers of all ranks, nationalities and beliefs.

When their ship is in port they are provided with online shopping, Ship visiting, welfare services (including a Chaplain and chapel on site) and free internet which is sometimes the only way these sailors can be in contact with their families. All services are free of charge.

Jenny, one of our Sub Branch members advised that they also provide second hand clothes and other personal items. She also said that if anyone has any spare wool hidden in the back of the cupboard they would appreciate donation of knitted beanies and scarves. If you can assist them goods can be left at RSL Headquarters and Jenny will pick them up and take them to the Centre.

ASSISTANCE FOR VETERANS?

Redlands RSL Sub Branch is here to support veterans and their families, helping them find purpose, connection, and assistance whenever it is needed.

From time to time, veterans ask what the RSL can offer them if they become members of our Sub Branch. Every Sub Branch is different. Some have fewer than 20 members, while others have over 2,000. Each Sub Branch works within its available resources to support veterans and their families and to uphold the Objects of the League.

Located at RSL Headquarters, 1–11 Passage Street, Cleveland, the Redlands RSL Sub Branch provides a range of services and activities, including:

Advocacy - Free assistance from qualified ADTP Advocates with DVA claims and appeals.

Commemorative Services - Support and participation in Anzac Day, Vietnam Veterans Day, Remembrance Day, Honouring the Fallen, and AWAMO Remembrance services.

Poppy Service - For a deceased veteran, provided at the request of the next of kin.

Wellbeing Support Officers - Home visits, transport assistance (where not covered by DVA entitlements), and referrals to appropriate support agencies.

Social Connection -

- **Golden Oldies** – every second Tuesday, free of charge for those over 80.
- **Veterans Cuppa** – on the second Wednesday of each month.
- **Bus Excursions** – approximately every six weeks at reasonable cost.

Member Involvement - Monthly meetings where members can contribute to decisions affecting the Sub Branch followed by camaraderie.

Practical Assistance - Gardening assistance for eligible veterans.

Communication - Monthly Bugle newsletter, Redlands RSL website, Facebook updates, and information displayed at the RSL.

Community Engagement -

- Collaboration with other ex-service organisations (contact details available in the Bugle and on RSL TV screens).

3 Sept 1939	Britain, France, Australia, and New Zealand declare war on Germany	The German invasion of Poland led to the declaration of war against Germany by the United Kingdom and France and began the Second World War.
8 Sept 1951	Peace treaty (Second World War) signed with Japan	The peace treaty signalled the formal end of hostilities with Japan, though the fighting had ended some six years before.
12 Sept 1955	2nd Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, advance party arrive in Penang, Malaya	Australian forces served in Malaya as part of the Far East Strategic Reserve. Their primary role was to deter external communist aggression against south-east Asia and their secondary role was to assist in the suppression of the communist insurrection in Malaya.
15 Sept 1939	Australian Government announces mobilisation of the militia and the establishment of the second AIF for service abroad	Australia needed to raise a volunteer force for overseas service in the Second World War while the militia were only allowed to serve in Australian territories.
16 Sept 1943	Japanese abandon Lae after heavy fighting	Lae was the focus of a major land, sea, and air operation by Australian and American forces. Fighting lasted until 16 September when the encircled Japanese garrison were either killed, captured, or escaped.
20 Sept 1912	Official approval given for the establishment of a military Central Flying School. Official formation of the Australian Flying Corps	The Australian Flying Corps went on to serve in Mesopotamia, the Middle East, and the Western Front and was the forerunner of the RAAF.
23 Sept 1940	HMAS Australia action at Dakar	HMAS Australia begins action against Vichy French at Dakar, West Africa.
26-27 Sept 1943	Operation Jaywick destroys Japanese shipping	An Australian Special Operations Australia Unit operating from the former fishing vessel, Krait, mines Japanese ships in Singapore Harbour. Seven ships were sunk or badly damaged.
28 Sept 1950	3rd Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment arrives in Korea	The Battalion was immediately committed to the United Nations' northward advance against the retreating North Koreans.
